# Class 6

Class 6 is having an amazing time, learning all sorts of new and exciting things!

We are reading the Thirteen Story Treehouse in English. After reading the chapter called The Adventures of Super Finger, students used a program on the Tap It to create their own super heroes!

In Numeracy, we are learning about Data. Throughout the term, students will be taking turns to ask each other data collection questions and exploring different ways that this information can be represented, such as with tally marks and various types of graphs.

We are continuing our Geography unit, which we started in Term 3. So far, Class 6 has learnt about different Australian landscapes (Desert, Ocean, Urban, Rainforest, Bush and Country). We will soon move into exploring information about various Asian countries and looking at what is the same and different about each of these countries, in comparison to Australia.

Students have been enjoying their dance and music lessons for our Creative and Performing Arts unit this term. In dance, students focus on moving to the music. In our Friday afternoon music lessons, we team up with Class 5. We focus on a different instrument each week and students follow the beat, identifying whether the music is fast or slow, and loud or soft.

Class 6 is continuing to meet with our buddy class, Class 12 this term, to participate in STEM activities. In Week 1, students took a virtual reality whale watching tour! We are really looking forward to our next STEM lesson with Class 12.

We anticipate that Term 4 will continue to be a wonderful learning experience for everyone in Class 6, as we move on toward the end of the year!!!













# Class 15

This term we have started bowling with Class 16.

Last week was our first week and we travelled to Blacktown using public transport. We first caught a bus and then got the train. It was a new experience for everyone changing from bus to train.

The programme focuses on skill development and fostering ongoing participation. Sessions are kept short and active to maintain student engagement; encouraging the students to become more involved in the sport and continue to be active.

We had some very talented bowlers in our presence. Kai was our top scorer for the day with 110 points. Georgia, Michael, Vinny and Denzel also showed off their great talents and continually improved on their technique throughout the session. Everyone is already excited about going again this week.
