This week students are taking the opportunity to explore and play in the playground during class time. Staff are completing risk assessments on the individual play items. We are waiting for the hammock and a play panel to be put in. Next week the playground will be used by all students daily during break times.

Parent Information Session

On Wednesday, 22nd August we held a Parent Information Session on Parent Wellbeing, the new structure of the day, Class 19 and External Validation. Thank you to those parents that attended, your input is valued. Please find some of the information discussed below:

The New Structure of the Day

After trialling and evaluating the new structure of the day, students and staff are very positive in regards to the benefits. Teachers have reported there is more time in class and more learning taking place, students have adapted to the change extremely well – behaviour incidents have decreased, many areas of the playground and the school in general are being used more often, such as; the library, kitchen, hall, bike track and oval. Classes have more time in the hydrotherapy pool and more time to access the community.

Father's Day

This year The Ponds School is very fortunate to have Bunnings and Woolworths generously donate gifts for our students to give on Father's Day. Each student will receive two gifts to give and have the opportunity to purchase gifts from the parent run stall.

External Validation

Currently The Ponds School External Validation Team is busy completing the requirements for External Validation. What is External Validation?

As part of the ongoing school planning, self-assessment and reporting cycle of School Excellence, all schools self asses their practices using the School Excellence Framework (SEF) across the domains of Learning, Teaching and Leading.

Every 5 years the school will complete External Validation. External Validation provides an opportunity for schools to discuss their judgements about the school's practice – and the evidence that underpins them- with a panel of peers.

On the 25th October the panel will visit our school. This panel will comprise of a Principal, School Leadership (PSL) and a peer Principal and will consider the school's evidence using the School Excellence Framework (SEF). After this process we will have a document that will illustrate the areas in which The Ponds School excels, the areas that we are sustaining and growing, and the areas that we are delivering. The External Validation report will assist us on our journey of continuous improvement.

Reminder

If you are dropping your child off at school in the mornings, please wait in the gated area near the office until a staff member comes to escort students down to their classrooms. Students will be supervised by class staff while unpacking bags, participating in hygiene procedures and playing in the Cola before the 9am bell. All staff are on duty at this time.
