We are all in the midst of busy times. Here at The Ponds School students are busy learning a variety of new skills in a range of environments. Caring about themselves and others being safe at all times. Staff are busy teaching, report writing, evaluating and planning for the end of year and for 2019. There are many special events that are happening during the last half of this term. Please read what's on above so you are aware of what is happening at the Ponds School.

Epilepsy Awareness Fundraising Day

The Ponds School supported Epilepsy Awareness Day by wearing the colour purple, donating a gold coin and purchasing merchandise such as: Purple helium filled balloons, purple playdough and plaster moulds to paint. Thank you to all that contributed to the final total raised \$324. Every student received a free pair of purple shoelaces and a wristband which were donated by Epilepsy Action Australia.

Official Opening of the Accessible Playground

The culmination of all the fundraising and planning and building occurred on Thursday 8 November with the Official Opening of our Accessible Playground. This was an opportunity to thank all those that contributed to the mammoth fundraising effort. We thank: Variety Children's Charity, Blacktown The Ponds Lions Club, Australian Lions Foundation, TAG Financial, The Primary Club, Wiggles and Giggles, Commonwealth Bank – Rouse Hill and Making it Happen-for Children with Disabilities.

Thank you goes to all those families and friends that supported the fundraising that has occurred in our school over the past three years.

What is great about our playground? Every day I see students learning new skills in the playground. By expanding the outdoor learning areas with accessible playground equipment, we aim to improve student skills and outcomes in the following areas.

Social Skills: students will learn to take turns, develop relationships, share, initiate activities with others, be able to self regulate and understand emotions.

It will enhance Communication: students will request activities independently, comment, make choices, describe experiences and the environment, and express feelings.

The playground will enhance Life Skills: such as decision making, assessing risks, being safe, understanding cause and consequences, following instructions, self-care and awareness of time and pre vocational work.

The equipment will support Physical development: both gross and fine motor skills, develop muscle tone and physical skills e.g climbing up and down stairs.

Students enjoy the Sensory nature of the equipment: It can help regulate sensory processing and develop touch, smell, hearing, sight and taste.

We can learn about Science in the playground: such as the various states of matter, textures, principles of physics such as gravity, motion and resistance, understand weather and seasons.

All this can be achieved by using our playground.

Student Placement Reviews

Student Placement Reviews take place on an annual basis. The purpose is to check on the appropriateness of your child's current placement at The Ponds School. Half the student reviews were completed on Monday 12 November and the remainder will be completed on Monday 19 November. MISSING LINK OFFICIALLY OPEN

LAST Thursday The Ponds School officially opened its \$200,000 playground which was 'the only thing missing' from its grounds. The school caters for 112 students from kindergarten to Year living with a moderate or severe intellectual disability. After opening on a temporary site at Riverstone High School in 2012, the school moved to its

premises at The Ponds Blvd in 2015.

"We moved to our new school in 2015 and it was fantastic; the only thing that was missing was a playground," principal Leonie Donaldson said.

"Wanting our students to be learning, engaged, healthy and happy are the reasons we built the playground."

Plenty of grants and fundraising went into making the project a reality,

which cost just under \$200,000, Ms Donaldson said.

The new facility is a far cry from other traditional playgrounds and features specialist equipment.
That includes a wheelchair-accessible slide tower, a trampoline for students in wheelchairs, a hammock, climbing nets and softfall and artificial grass.
The school thanked all those people who helped make the project a reality.

























Making It Happen


