For this to happen daily we need parents /carers to ensure their child is ready to leave on time. The drivers and transport support officers are only required to wait 3 minutes. We also need parents/carers to be home when their child arrives home from school. We do understand that sometimes things happen and in this situation please ring the contractor, driver or transport support officer to inform them of your emergency situation.

Class 10 have been doing a wonderful job settling into new class routines. All students transition successfully to and from their buses. Students are learning to respond to the bell and return to class following play breaks.

In class, informal assessment is underway with teacher and SLSOs gaining understanding of students' current levels of knowledge and skills in Literacy and Numeracy. Interactive touch screen activities are a big hit with all students engaged for short periods, using applications such as Reading Eggs, Mathseeds and HelpKidzLearn. With one on one support all students practice target skills in Maths such as counting with one to one correspondence, counting collections of objects and numeral recognition. In Literacy students are learning vocabulary in the PODD communication book, reading high frequency word books and working with letters to make words.

Our History program is underway this semester and we are looking forward to learning about Being Independent as part of our Personal Development and Health Program. We have just started accessing the pool, with all students swimming twice a week.

Class 17

Class 17 have started the year off with a bang! We have started our own veggie garden and planted snow peas and carrots. We have commenced community access and are now walking to the shops and learning to locate and buy ingredients for our cooking. We are learning to care for our classroom and belongings by ensuring we always clean up after ourselves. We hope you like our photos!


