I know these are rare incidents and the majority of The Ponds School Community uphold the values included in our Wellbeing Procedures and listed above. Thank you!

Student Absences

Education for your child is important and regular attendance is essential for your child to achieve their educational best. The Education Act 1990 requires that parents ensure their child of compulsory school age is enrolled at, and regularly attends school. On occasion your child may need to be absent from school. Following an absence from school you must ensure that the school is provided with a written explanation for the absence. This written explanation needs to be given to the school within 7 days of the first day of absence.

Please note that an "*exemption*" can no longer be granted for students travelling during term time, including family holidays and other extended travel. An application for Extended Leave – travel must be completed for consideration by the Principal prior to any leave being taken. If granted the absence will be recorded as" *leave*". For some of our students medical conditions may impact on school attendance or they may need to attend doctors' or therapy appointments and assessments during school hours. These absences also require a written explanation, medical certificate or certificate of attendance at the appointment. By doing this we are following all school and Departmental (DEC) policies and procedures and ensuring the very best learning outcomes for all our students at The Ponds School. Congratulations to the Ponds possums dance group who performed at the official Opening of North Kellyville PS. Thank you to the staff that provide the instruction and organised the performance. You all did us proud and contribute to the great reputation our school has within our community!

2019 will be another fun year ahead with lots of options to catch up with other parents, to fundraise and to get involved.


We hope you have had a great break over the holidays

Alternative Access Workshop

Note: Completion of a two-day PODD introductory workshop is a pre-requisite for this course.

Workshop Content:

A one-day workshop for speech pathologists, teachers, parents, carers, and professionals specialising in Augmentative and Alternative Communication

The focus of this workshop is on PODD communication books designed for individuals who cannot point directly to a display with their hands. The content will build on the information relating to the purpose, design principles, intervention strategies and use of PODD communication books covered in the two-day introductory workshop.

A range of alternative access PODD communication book will be discussed including: eyegaze (eye-pointing), partner-assisted scanning (visual, auditory, visual plus auditory scanning), combination access, and coded access. The design features to suit individuals and the procedures to operate and teach each access method will be presented. Participants will have the opportunity to practice each access method

Learning Outcomes:

- Participants will be able to: · Describe the different PODD design considerations/options to accommodate for alternative access methods.
- Outline the considerations for selecting different access methods to suit individual requirements
- Perform the partner operational procedures to use a range of alternate access methods.
- Problem-solve methods for developing operational skills for individuals who have severe • movement difficulties (e.g. developing accept/reject movements for scanning).


