P&C / Charity - Further information

We held a Zoom meeting on Tuesday 2nd March to gain more information on forming a P&C or re-establishing our Charity. Our aim was to record the meeting, but unfortunately this could not happen so you will see the information discussed below. We were fortunate to have Debbie Clifford from the P&C as part of our Zoom meeting. The next step will be a survey to gain your feedback in regards to what you would like to be part of in the future. <u>P&C information from Debbie Clifford</u>

P&Cs are autonomous from the school a community meeting will need to be held to establish a P&C. A working party would be formed, we could have as many people participate as we like but no fewer than 5 and we would require a person to be the convener

- The working party would decide on a constitution, by-laws and membership processes
- The P&C Association provides fact sheets on all of the processes and procedures needed
- Then a Foundation meeting would be held and everyone would gain the information that the working party had put together
- Office bearers would be elected (can have 5 or 4 with a casual vacancy for the 5th member) and they would become signatories on accounts
- An Incorporated P&C is a legal entity and thus office bearers are not individually liable. An Incorporated P&C is able to employ people and apply for grants
- The P&C Association give newly established P&Cs free membership for one year and 50 million dollar Public Liability Insurance. Insurance after the first year is up to the P&C
- The P&C Association offer student injury insurance for a fee which covers students in and outside of school
- The P&C association has relevant information on their website and P&Cs can adopt what is on the website. Debbie Clifford would assist us
- The decision makers of a P&C are not the Office bearers but the members. Office bearers are the management team
- P&Cs are a charity and ACNC registered

Purpose: To raise money and have a voice in The Ponds Schools planning and financial management and hear what is happening at The Ponds School.

Making It Happen ... for Children with Disabilities

- Established in 2014, held a membership drive and an Annual General Meeting to elect office bearers
- Office Bearers included: Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, Secretary, Treasurer and members
- The office bearers wrote the constitution, objects and statement of purpose.
- A logo was developed
- Meetings were held on a regular basis
- Difficulties included: accountancy/MYOB, completing the ACNC, ASIC and ATO paperwork
- Many fundraising activities were held. The charity donated \$20 000 towards our fist bus and donated the same amount towards our inclusive playground

- Conduct regular reviews for every student attending the ponds school to help determine the most suitable educational placement
- Collect information through psychological assessments and
- observation of the student, teacher and parents
- Write School Counsellor reports providing a summary of the assessment results and recommendations for the continued support of the student
- Link families to appropriate services that can support their child's ongoing needs
- Provide advice to the school to help support the learning and wellbeing of students.


Health Precinct
